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Rules:

- Each row (ten cells wide) is a valid math equation made entirely of numbers and operators
- At the same time, each box (6x5) is a valid Wordle made entirely of letters
- Within every pair of Wordles, there are exactly 15 letters used. Each letter corresponds to one of the 15 mathematical symbols.
- This assignment of letters to math symbols is a one-to-one correspondence. It applies throughout this pair of Wordles
- There are no leading zeroes or negative numbers in the equations
- Operators (=, +, -, *, /) are always between two numbers
- There is exactly one = in each row
- * and / have higher precedence than + and -. All operators are left-associative
